NYC - A Foundational Experience

I had the good fortune to attend National Youth Conference this year, as did many youth across the country; however, I was under the unique circumstance of being a returning participant. One does not often have the opportunity to experience a life-changing event twice, but I was lucky enough to be old enough to attend in 2018 and young enough to attend in 2022. As a returner and as a relatively old person, I noticed some fantastic and amazing things that I believe bode really well for the Church of the Brethren in its entirety.

Even from the beginning, I could feel that the youth attending this NYC were going to be special. The Virlina District, from which I hail, has sent their youth to Colorado on a charter bus for decades. Church youth groups are combined, kids mingle, and advisors readjust their pillows as our two, later three, buses began the week-long journey across the country. We crossed through many states along the way, from West Virginia to Wyoming, stopping at such sights as Mount Rushmore and the Crazy Horse Memorial, both located in South Dakota. While the rolling plains of Wyoming and the terracing, colorful canyons of the Badlands were stunningly beautiful, the most beautiful factor of the bus trip was watching the friendships form between all the different youth in such a short amount of time. For some kids, the only things they had in common was their faith, their denominational background. Yet, over the week of being crammed in buses together, playing games in hotels, and breaking bread together, some truly special relationships arose. I expected to play a bigger role in getting younger participants to interact with each other, but there was no need: they all came into the journey with the mindset of positivity and connection. I can tell that the friendships made on this trip and at the Conference itself will last for the lifetimes of all who attended.

National Youth Conference was truly a week to remember. For a Brethren, there was just about everything one could hope for. "Peacefully, simply together" shirts, pickup 4-square games, food in the cafeteria akin to a potluck in size, and enough familiar faces to keep the conversations flowing. Whether participating in small groups, workshops, a late-night activity, or a service project, there was never a dull moment. Yet, the best part of the entire conference were the worship services. Moby Arena would fill with excited youth and advisors alike as the countdown began, with fantastic music soon to follow. Youths were even invited to lead worship, play music, and read scripture, giving a level of immersion and ownership over the Conference that is unique to NYC. The speakers were beyond amazing. The theme of this NYC was Foundational, and these speakers really touched the heart of what is foundational to the faith journey of the youth attending. Whether encouraging the youth to do what God calls them to do today, every day, to stating that God keeps our lives from simply going in circles, allowing us to go beyond what we think ourselves capable of.

Foundational served well as the theme of National Youth Conference because the Conference itself will serve as the foundation for the spiritual journeys of hundreds of youth for years to come. This event was only the beginning for a much greater potential, not just for the participants, but for the entire Church of the Brethren. I was fortunate to have a sort of eagle-eyed view of this conference: I was young enough to truly participate but old enough to look past the experience as it was. What I saw for two weeks, whether on a bus or at the conference, was a group of kids who are going to change the world. I had never met more friendly, more kind, more spiritual, more loving people in my life, and every second of it was unconditional and unprovoked. They wanted to be with each other, they wanted to come closer to God, they wanted to make the absolute best of their time together. Once they realize the power God has given them in their love, there will be nothing they cannot accomplish. If this is the future of the Brethren church, then the future shines bright like the Sun.
